

CRITERIA

The sponsor is looking for a paediatric physiotherapist or group of therapists (multi disciplinary groups are eligible as long as one member is a qualified paediatric physiotherapist) who can demonstrate the following:

- 1 The need for innovation
- 2 Originality of the idea, knowledge of other work/products in this area
- 3 Complexity of project tackled
- 4 Perceived benefit
- 5 Theoretical basis for the innovation
- 6 Implementation
- 7 Evaluation of work completed so far
- 8 Future plans for the innovation
- 9 Good standard of overall content/presentation
- 10 The potential for raising profile of paediatric PT

The innovation may be a service, a treatment, a piece of equipment, a recording system for assessment or treatment, or in fact anything you can prove has, by its instigation, the potential to improve or update the therapist's work. You will need to include evidence of implementation.

ENTRY

The innovation should be explained within 1500 words, typed in double spacing on numbered A4 paper clearly marked with entry title, giving information on the points noted above. Where appropriate, record sheets, photographs or other documents may be attached to your entry (marked clearly with your name). At the end of your entry you should write a paragraph outlining your proposed use of the Award money should you win. You may also be invited to produce a poster presentation of your innovation to be displayed at the APCP Annual Conference.

All entries may be summarised and published in the APCP Journal or Jenx Innovator.

Closing Date: 28th February 2010.

JUDGES

The panel of Judges will include one Judge from APCP Executive Committee, one from Jenx Limited and at least two independent judges who understand from first hand experience the requirements of special needs children. Judging will take place in March 2010.

PRIZE

There will be one overall prize of £1,500. Should the innovation relate to a piece of equipment, Jenx Limited may undertake the production of a prototype if appropriate. The winner will be notified in June and the presentation of the award will take place at conference where possible. The winner will be asked to provide information to the judges within 12 months of winning on how the prize money has been spent. Winners may apply to Jenx Limited for financial assistance to attend the Prize Presentation at Conference. This assistance may be to a maximum of £100.00.

ELIGIBILITY

The Award is open to all paediatric physiotherapists based in the UK except members of the APCP Executive Committee. Entries which have already formed part of a research project or educational qualification will not be valid entries. Products which are being developed by a manufacturer or which are already commercially available will not be eligible.
